- Spread by soldiers after WWI
- Infected 1/3 of world's population
- 50 million died, including 675,000 in the United States
- No vaccine available

St. Louis








DIFFERENT APPROACHES, DIFFERENT RESULTS

- Delayed shut down
- 748 deaths per 100,000
- Highest peak death rate

St. Louis
